1. RULES

The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing for 2021-2024, including the US Sailing Prescriptions* and the class rules of the Flying Scot class, and the Sailing Instructions.

2. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 2.1. The Fair Winds Memorial Regatta is open to all boats of the Flying Scot class whose skippers are members of the Flying Scot Sailing Association (FSSA), and Lasers. You can join FSSA by going to www.fssa.com, or by calling (800) 445-8629.
- 2.2. Check-in and Registration will be held between 8:30 and 10:00 AM Saturday, September 10th

FEES

3.1. THIS IS A FREE REGATTA, intended to serve as a memorial to those sailors with whom we've enjoyed sailing, but can no longer sail with us. We ask only that participants consider making a charitable, tax-deductible donation in whatever amount you deem appropriate to Cindy's Fund. Please make your check payable to: Cindy's Fund and return it with this completed form. All donations are voluntary, and there is no minimum donation, but completing a registration form is mandatory for entry and scoring in the regatta. Registration will be available at DCLSA

4. RACES

- 4.1. The Championship, Challenger and Laser/Open Fleets will compete in multiple races.
- 4.2 The Masters Fleet (combined age of skipper and crew at least 120 years, with skipper at least 60 years old) will compete in up to two races, with no more than one race each day.

5. SCHEDULE

6. VENUE

Registration, meals and Skippers' Meeting will be held at the Deep Creek Lake Sailing Association, 204 Yacht Club Road, Swanton, MD, 21561. Races will be conducted on the southern portion of Deep Creek Lake, Maryland. Local sailors make a limited amount of lodging available free for regatta sailors. Coordinate with the contact listed below for availability, or for local hotel/motel/campground points of contact.

7. SCORING

- 7.1. Will be according to the RRS A4. Each boat's score shall be the total of her race scores with no race excluded. This modifies RRS A2.
- 7.2. Multiple races are scheduled for Championship and Challenger Fleet; two races are scheduled for Masters Fleet. One race constitutes a regatta.

8.. PRIZES

1st through 3rd places in each Fleet. Prizes are specifically intended to comprise leftovers and castoffs from previous seasons. As such, description, uniformity, quality and even hygiene cannot be quaranteed.

9. ENTRIES

- a. To be eligible to compete in the Fair Winds Regatta, competitors shall enter by submitting a completed entry form before 10:30 AM on Saturday, September 10, 2021.
- b. Entrants are encouraged to register in the class in which they feel comfortable sailing

Flying Scot Championship Division, displaying a gold streamer

Flying Scot Challenger Division, displaying a blue or black streamer

Flying Scot Masters Division (Skipper 60 years of age or older, plus age of next oldest crew \geq 120 years), displaying a green streamer

Laser / Open Division. Open division will include any sail-powered vessel

Appropriate streamers and sail tape will be available at the Competitors' Meeting.

10. NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

Notices to competitors will be posted on the Notice Boards located on the pavilion level of DCLSA. It is the responsibility of each participant to check the board for posted changes. Posting to the boards constitutes notice to all competitors.

11. CHANGES IN SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- a. Any changes in the Sailing Instructions will be posted before 9:00 AM on Saturday and 8:30 AM on Sunday.
- b. Any change in the starting time for the first race on Sunday will be posted by 7:00 PM on Saturday.

12 SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

Signals made ashore will be displayed from the flagpole located at the Turkey Neck club, and by radio announcement on VHF channel 19A.

13. SCHEDULE OF RACES

Saturday, September 9th

1030 Competitors' Meeting Turkey Neck Yacht Club

1130 Half hour signal for race 1 and 2, Masters race 1 Shore Break followed by subsequent races

Sunday September 10th

Half Hour signal for days racing, Masters race 2 and 4

1400/ASAP TROPHY PRESENTATION

- b. The Masters fleet will sail one race of each day.
- c. No Warning Signal will be made after 2pm on Sunday, September 10th.

14. THE COURSE

- a. Illustration depicts the course to be sailed.
- b. The course to be sailed will be displayed by flag 1, 2, or 3 from the committee boat.
- c. Boats must pass between gate marks from the direction of the previous mark and round either mark.
- d. If a gate is not present, a single mark shall be left to port.
- e. <u>Boats shall not sail between a Turkey Neck Club mooring and the Turkey Neck shore when racing.</u>
- f. In the event of a shortened course, the Race Committee will act in accordance with RRS 32.2.

15. MARKS

- a. Primary marks and gate marks will be red tetrahedrons.
- b. Change marks will be bright yellow and spherical.
- c. Offset Mark will be a white sphere.
- d. The Starting/Finishing Mark will be an inflated orange cylinder.

16. THE START

- a. Races will be started in accordance with RRS Appendix U. This modifies RRS 26.
- b. The starting order will be championship, challenger, Masters, Laser/open.
- c. At the start of the first race, a gather signal, Code flag "L" will be hoisted with a sound signal approximately 30 minutes prior to the Warning Signal for the first Division for each race.
- d. The starting line will lie between a Signal Boat staff displaying an orange flag and the windward side of the Starting Mark.

- f. Before the Warning Signal for the first race each day, boats shall pass astern of the Signal Boat on starboard tack and hail their sail number, which will be acknowledged by the Race Committee. A boat failing to hail will be notified of its failure and, for a subsequent infringement, may be scored DNS.
- g. Boats not starting shall keep clear of the starting area and boats whose Warning Signal has been made.
- h. A boat shall not start later than three (3) minutes after its division's starting signal.

17. RECALLS

- a. Individual recalls will be signaled in accordance with RRS 29.1.
- b. As a courtesy, the Race Committee will attempt to hail OCS boats verbally and or by VHF radio channel 19A. The failure of any boat to hear the hail, an untimely hail of OCS boats, failure to hail any boats, and the order of the boats in the hail shall not be grounds for granting redress. This changes RRS 62.1(a).

18. THE FINISH

- a. The finish line shall be between a RC or Signal Boat staff displaying an orange flag and the Finishing Mark. The Signal Boat at the finish will display a blue flag indicating it is in position on the finish line.
- b. Code flag "R" displayed by the Signal Boat at the finish signifies that racing will continue.
- c. Code flag "A" displayed by the Signal Boat at the finish line signifies "No more racing today."

19. THE TIME LIMIT

- a. If the lead boat of the first starting division does not reach the first mark within 20 minutes, the race for all divisions will be abandoned.
- b. A division flag displayed with another visual signal means that the signal applies to that Division only. No Division flag displayed means that the signal applies to all Divisions.
- c. The time limit for each division race will be 60 minutes for the first boat of its division to sail the course and finish.
- d. Boat(s) still racing 20 minutes after the first boat of its division finishes and not thereafter retiring, being penalized or given redress, will be scored TLE (Time Limit Expired), with points equal to the number of boats finishing within the time limit plus one point. This changes RRS 35, 63.1 and A5.
- e. If boats in or near last place in a race are delaying the start of another race, the Race Committee may terminate their race and score those boats based on their position at the time the race is terminated.

20. PROTESTS / PENALTY

- a Protest Forms will be available at the Turkey Neck club. Protests will be heard by the Protest Committee in the approximate order received. The Protest Chairperson will determine the time and place of the hearing.
- b. The protest period will be 45 minutes after the race committee docks at the Turkey Neck club and will be signified by code flag B and one sound signal. Dock time will be announced on VHF channel 19A.

21. SCORING

- a. The Low Point Scoring System of RRS Appendix A will apply, except that each boat's total score will be the sum of her scores for all races. This changes Rule A2.
- b. One race shall be completed to constitute a regatta.

22. SAFETY

- a. Boats are subject to verification by the race committee that they have all safety equipment on board as required by their class rules.
- b. A boat retiring from a race shall notify the Race Committee either upon leaving the course or, if that is impracticable, immediately upon arriving ashore.
 - c. By entering this event each individual acknowledges that he/she is familiar with the RRS, especially RRS 1.2, "Life Saving Equipment and Personal Flotation" and RRS 4, "Decision to Race."
 - d. A boat may monitor VHF Channel 19A before and during racing. Any transmission from a boat racing, unless a call for assistance or to report retirement from the race, shall result in disqualification.
 - E. All competitors shall comply with the DCYRA Safe and Healthy Sailing Guidelines.

23. REGATTA CREW SUBSTITUTIONS

a. Crew substitutions are allowed.
